#### C GRADE – SEASON REPORT – BY ROB ANDREWS

It's been another great season for the C grade fellas, unfortunately unable to make that final hurdle again in the Two Day GF but fighting till the end in the true Wests spirit and still claiming the One Day Premiership and finishing the season as Minor Premiers for the 3rd year running!

We did not lose a match in the One Dayers! We played a very attacking brand of cricket in this form with Billy Oakes, aka Bully Oakes, aka Billy May in rare touch with Josh and Aqeel chipping in with consistent runs we were able to post big scores and easily defend them with our big fast bowling openers Flip and Dale taking a lot of early wickets and Gecko finishing them off. Billy scored 271 runs at an average of 54.2, Josh scored 171 runs at a massive average of 85.5 and Acka totaled 158 at an average of 52.67. Our top bowling efforts were from Dale Hunt with 10 wickets at 7.8, Gecko took 9 with an average of 9.33 and Dan Mortimer 5 wickets with an average of 13.8.

In the Grand final we batted first against Uni with Aqeel scoring a great 124 not out and Josh playing a very mature innings of 74 to post a massive 256 runs from our 40 overs. Uni were never really in it and with some rain delay were eventually bowled out for 96 with Gecko taking a 5/37, our first C grade One Day title at Wests for 15 years.

In the Two Day format we were able to secure three outright victories during the season which was eventually the difference in us finishing at the top of the ladder and getting our 3rd Minor Premiership in three seasons. Billy was our top performer with the bat yet again scoring 550 runs at an average of 68.75, Acka scored 337 at an average of 48.14 and Gecko with 277 at 39.57. Our top bowling performers were Dale with 26 wickets at an average of 17.08, Flip with 24 at 14.33 and Gecko with 15 wickets at 12.27.

In the final we didn't quite bat to our potential and only scored 121 runs with a gritty knock of 35 from Quades the only batting highlight of the day. Never to back away from a fight though we got stuck into Uni and had them 7/111 but were unable to claim the last three wickets in time, Uni scoring 174. Dale claimed another 5 for but all the boys bowled extremely well. We scored quickly in our second innings with Gecko smashing 72 and Billy with 67 to set up a game. We had 46 overs at Uni to knock them over on Sunday arvo and with two quick wickets to Flip were hopeful of a good result but to their credit they were able to shut up shop and see the day out only 3 wickets down.

Shauny kept really well again this season with 25 dismissals and 5 run out assists. Big mits Flip took 15 catches, Gecko and myself took 11 and Quades with 10. Everyone contributed to the team and played a part in our results.

Some of our players were able to really lift a peg from last season which was great to see. Billy batted like an absolute demon scoring four 100's and three 50's, a season I'm sure he won't forget. Flip bowled a lot more overs this season and was rewarded well and there were some typical outstanding performances from guys like Dale Hunt taking a bag of wickets, Aqeel amounting a ton of runs and Gecko with his great all-rounder efforts.

I'm very proud of the way these guys played as a team, backed each other and left everything out on the field each and every match. Sadly Gecko lost his dad during the season but one thing that made me proud was how the club and our team rallied behind Gecko and Kimi. We were well supported again by Wests number one fan and 'Wests Warrior Queen' Kimi Dorge her support throughout the season was fantastic and whenever the boys needed a bit of a pick up or a laugh we could count on Kimi to provide. Thank you to Bobbie-Lee for your support putting up with the captain stuff and all the players partners for their support this season. To Dan and Rossco for all their work behind the scenes thank you and all the guys that subbed in too like Big Tal and Sam Neil. Thanks everyone for contributing to another successful and enjoyable season of C grade.

#### **RESERVE GRADE – SEASON REPORT – BY DAN GABBETT**

I think this season could easily be summarized as "The Year that Could Have Been". Our Reggies team played some really great cricket, some solid cricket and then a few days of very ordinary cricket. Unfortunately, those couple of days of ordinary cricket cost us finals spots in 2 day and 1 day cricket. You could argue results of other games didn't help us but at the end of the day if we had played to our ability each and every day during the season then we would have been in control of our own destiny and not have to rely on other teams results. Reserve grade is the breeding ground of our next crop of A grade players and one of our major aims was to ensure that the Senior guys in the team were teaching our younger guys how to play tough cricket – be patient when batting and put a price on your wicket, bowl tight lines and field well. When we look at the results of our younger guys who played some A grade during the year as well as the improvement of our entire squad, I think we can still consider the season reasonably successful even though we didn't play finals.

We tied 1<sup>st</sup> in the One day comp after the fixture rounds but missed out on the final due to run rate and only missed the 2 day finals by 3 points. When we look at the team's that played in the reserve grade finals we should be very hungry for next year as we have proven we can match or beat all 3 of those teams. We had some great batting performances including scoring 309 chasing 315 against Uni in round 1 as well as scoring 330 against Railways with the highlight being Ben Leamon's maiden century. Watching Ben bat with such confidence in A grade later in the season proves the value in learning your game well in Reserve grade, knowing what works for you as a batsman and what doesn't and then applying that in a higher grade. A summary of the season for each of our regular players is below

**Scott Burt**: Burty's batting has been one of the finds of the season. His match saving 85 against Mets in Round 3 was a knock of great maturity and gave Scott a lot of confidence. He was our opening bat for the latter half of the season and I believe found a role that suited his game. A great guy to have around the team.

**Anthony Nunn**: Nunny is the glue that holds our team together. This season his batting was outstanding with his 95 not out against Railways a highlight. With 30 wickets he proved he is still the smartest bowler in the reserve grade comp while his slips catching is superb. Throw in the fact he packs an esky full of water bottles, has a first aid kit the envy of an ambulance officer AND pre-pulls a freshly made Pull-Apart for us then it's obvious our team would be lost without him.

**Luke Neale:** In the second half of the season Luke was the leader of our attack and rose to the challenge exceptionally well. He is a very smart cricketer with no greater example of this being our 1 day game against Uni where they were 1/127 when Luke came on for his second spell. His bowling plan against a high quality cricketer worked perfectly and brought us back into the match to send us on to a great win. A future leader of our club which may prove to be a problem as he probably won't give his younger brother a bat or a bowl...

**Peter Schiekowski:** Despite now being on the wrong side of 40 (and maybe 50!), Shush is still one of the most competitive men in our club. While he accepts defeat in the right spirit, he hates losing. In our first game of the season he showed our young guys what senior cricket was all about with a superb 91 to almost lead us to victory chasing 315. The fact he was more devastated about us falling 6 runs short of a win instead of almost getting a century proves what a great team man he is. Extremely happy that Jan Neale continued the tea break baking tradition Alexia Gabbett started 2 years ago.

**Aidan Doolan:** Went from our first change bowler in the first few games to the quickest opening bowler in reserve grade by the time he left for Grammar cricket duties. Doolo bowls great areas and showed in his couple of A grade games he is a genuine wicket taker. Rewarded with selection in the Qld Cricket Under 16 squad which was well deserved.

**Dan Gabbett:** Started the first game with an 80 and then managed to prove during the rest of the season what a fluke that was. Did take some unique slips catches and showed the young boys what athleticism really means with one catch in the covers. Having Will and Burty in the team meant he didn't get to bowl as much as he probably deserved

**Donovan Spanner**: Donovan showed on several occasions the amount of shots he has. Was disappointed to get out several times after good starts but his last knock against Mets showed what he is truly capable of when he gets going. Worked hard on his wicketkeeping throughout the season and took some great catches, especially once he realized our 1<sup>st</sup> slip was unlikely to catch anything. Recovered very quickly from Schoolies week (still too early Donny??)

**Ben Luther:** Our international jetsetter Lex may be considering retirement but showed on a couple of occasions he still has plenty to offer our club. A move down the order reaped rewards with his knock against Uni in the second half of the season showcasing his cover driving ability. Also showed he is still a quality wicketkeeper whenever he stood in for Donovan and took some excellent catches at mid-off during the season.

#### A GRADE – SEASON REPORT - BY BRIAN MAY

After two successful seasons, the season of 2015/2016 was always going to throw up its challenges. Could we continue to emulate the performances of the past? The team was comprised of the majority of the premiership squad, but due to injuries and unavailability we welcomed a few new additions including; Matt Taffy-Doggy-Dog Humphries, Jacob Sommerfeld, Aiden Doolan, Donovan Spanner, Dan Anderson, Luke Neal, Will Skene and Scott Burt.

We started our pre-season early and played four invaluable trial matches.

Again the competition was split into three separate formats of T20, One day and Two day Open cricket.

#### T20 Comp

Thursday and Friday nights saw the return of the T20 competition, something we all thoroughly enjoyed, and we certainly looked forward to defending out title.

Our first match was against Mets, and we produced a solid batting performance. But, it was our bowlers who showed they were far too strong and led us to a comfortable win. We again gained confidence and belief by starting another campaign with a win.
