The 2016/17 season has been completed and by all measures, has been a great success. With the expectations set high reaching them was always going to be a challenge.

I personally want to thank Matt Humphreys for his contribution to the In2 Cricket program. This is a vital program to attract kids into the club and need to continue.

On the park A Grade started in magnificent form and all their hard work showed going through the pool rounds of the Harding Madsen Shield undefeated. The team went on to dominate the semi-final and grand final to win the competition in its inaugural year. Well done fellas. On the home front we attacked the T20 competitions with Res Grade and C Grade going down in the finals. D Grade had a tough year with a bye in the draw and forfeits meaning they missed an amount of cricket. Whilst we believe in the future of this grade it appears changes are on the way, perhaps not for the best. Well done to Des and his team for a gutsy season in trying conditions.

The Open Cricket rounds are where we excelled. All teams worked hard and played the Wests way and we secured our 4th straight Club Championship in the final round against NBD's. We won Minor Premierships in A, Res & B Grade which was a great result. On Grand Final day we had 4 of 5 grades represented. A, Res & B Grade all topped their Minor Premierships by becoming Premiers. C Grade fell agonisingly close to making 4 from 4 on the day. Brian May, Jake Gill, Glenn Perkins and Flip Martin all winning Man of the Match in their respective grades.

Our hardworking committee of Anthony Nunn, Gav Smith and Adam Quade continued to do the 1% in background that allows each and every one of you to turn up on game day and play. With the 2016/17 season coming to an end it is time to reflect on the season that has just passed for West's Reserve Grade. What a season it was, from start to finish, in both the T20 and the open cricket format.

Our season started with a T20 game, played immediately after our B grade team had completed theirs. This was a bit of a different start to the season to what we were used to, but it was great to be able to cheer on our fellow club mates and in turn have them support us afterwards. From a playing point of view, we finished the T20 season with 3 wins, 1 draw 2 losses leaving us third and playing University in the semi-final. Our bowlers working hard to keep University to 129 after their 20 overs, with a few twists and turns we hit the winning runs in the final over. We then packed up for a rushed trip from University to Middle Ridge Park to play Souths in the final. Bowling first Jake and Sam took some valuable wickets and with the rest of the bowling line up we kept Souths to what we felt was an achievable score of 127. Starting well and with Josh carrying his bat through the innings to finish with 48 not out and some good support from everyone involved we were on track to reach our target, however a few quick wickets towards the end of our allotted overs slowed our progress down and we unfortunately fell short in the end. Being runner's up in the T20 comp while not our desired result was still a great way to end the half-way point of the season, I know the team would have liked to have gone one better, but everyone involved helped the team achieve the goals we had set out at the start of the season and more importantly this format helped set up the team for our ultimate goal for the season which after a two-week break would be back underway.

Our open cricket started off in week two of the season and we found form immediately with the ball, bowling Railways out for 96 and our batsmen setting up an outright chance early on day two, however with at the tea break we had the opposition 6 wickets down as rain began to fall, we were unable to get back on and push for an outright result. This was an exceptional way to start the season. While there were many team and individual highlights throughout the season, our round 2 effort of chasing down University's 316 and Mark Burt's 151 not out would have to be right up there. We followed our round 2 effort with a hard-fought low scoring affair against Souths, our lower order putting a price on their wicket which was one of our major goals for the year, we were able to fight our way to 142 and with a strong bowling performance we bowled South's out for 123. These results putting us second leading into the T20 and Christmas break. Unable to make it back in time to play our first game back after the Christmas break against Digger's I had the pleasure of watching the guys fight up until the last minute. With Diggers 3/150 chasing 186 when I arrived, we were in a bit of trouble, however a lost ball and 7 wickets for 19 runs ensured we won by 10 runs. A solid bowling effort in both innings and a thoroughly enjoyable partnership between Will and Scott followed by some big hitting late in the day from Angus and Mark Dorge ensured we secured a vitally important outright win against Met's. Our only loss for the open cricket season came in round 6 against South's, everyone member stood up and put a price on their wicket when we batted and in the field in 38-degree heat (thankfully it was only 38 degrees as one of our team members was told he was not allowed to play if the temperature reached 40 degrees), everyone fought hard, but we couldn't quite get the result. Our games against University seem to be quite high scoring affairs over the past few years and our round 7 game continued this trend. Our total of 9/355 dec being set up by Angus Smith scoring 67 early on and continued with a quality knock of 80 by Sam Neale. The final game of the season saw us needing a win to ensure we finished first and our bowlers set the game up well on day 1 dismissing Digger's for 119 and our batsmen getting to within 60 runs with 4 wickets down at stumps. Sam showing the confidence gained from his previous innings along with Ben and Nick we passed the total and finish the season as minor premiers.

There have been some amazing individual efforts this season, however the highlight for me was the value we put on our wicket throughout the season and the ability of our bowling group to put consistent pressure on the opposition. Batting first in the final we fought hard to reach 138, a total we were confident was enough and two quick wickets before stumps further encouraged this view. We started day two slowly, with wicket's hard to come by, led by Jake and Scott we eventually took our first wicket for the day and from there wickets fell steadily. Some great ground fielding and catches assisted our bowlers, but Scott's catch, taking it running with his back to the ball looking into the sun was the highlight in the field for the day. Being sent back in to bat the afternoon out, we lost a few quick wickets, but Lex and Sam steadied the ship and then Lex and Talbo batted the rest of the afternoon out to ensure we completed the job and win West's first Reserve grade premiership for 20 years.

Continuing to achieve the club goal of rewarding our junior talent was a highlight of the season with Shaun McMinn and Mark Burt making their A grade debut's after strong performances for the Reserve grade team, as well as Scott Schultz and Sam Neale

playing important roles with both bat and ball throughout the season and in the final.

It has taken a lot of work from a lot of people over several seasons to achieve this result. Dan Gabbett has played a significant part both as a member of this team and a selector and I would like to thank him for his support. I would also like to thank Ross for his tireless work in ensuring we had a team each week and to Len who in his words “just steers the ship”, we all know that there is much more involved than that. Thank you.

A special thanks must go to the wives, partners and parents who supported us throughout the year, this support was greatly appreciated and without it we would not have been as successful.

Angus Smith: A new addition to the club this season and had an immediate impact with bat and with the gloves covering for Shaun, his innings of 67 against University being the highlight.

Mark Dorge: Mark is one of the most competitive players in the competition and his fighting roles with both bat and ball were invaluable to the team this season. His second innings knock against Met’s ensuring we scored quickly enough to win outright.

Will Skene: Will has continued to grow as a player since joining West’s and has stepped up with both bat and ball this season giving the team the balance it needed. His partnership with Scott in the first innings against Met’s being the highlight of the season.

Ben Luther: Once again Lex managed to mix travel and cricket this season. His form in the T20 and his captaincy skills were highlighted by leading the team to victory in the semi-final and a tight loss in the final and by his 49 not out in the open cricket final. His jetsetter lifestyle being curtailed for the short term by an announcement made towards the end of the season and the purchase of new cricket equipment recently has given the team confidence he will be back again next season.

Sam Neale: Starting the season in B grade, Sam quickly became an important member of the team with both bat and ball, his 80 not out was a special innings which I think was a sign of many more innings like that to come. Sam also took vital wickets and applied pressure when needed with the ball. His understanding of the game will see Sam taking a leading role in the very near future.

Peter Scheikowski: Along with Dorgie, Shush/Socks/Magda is another extremely competitive player proving that hard work and determination will ensure you succeed at any age. Peter started the season well, a slight lull in the middle and then produced some very important innings towards the end of the season including vital runs in the final.

Nick Talbot: Nick played a vital role, both with bat and ball and just as importantly working with the younger team members. Nick had a consistent season with the bat and took important wickets when needed, however the highlight was his two innings in the grand final where he top scored in the first innings and ensured we batted the rest of the day in the second innings.

Shaun McMinn: Shaun’s hard work and commitment over previous seasons saw him take the wicket keeping position role at the start of the season and quickly make this role his own. Shaun took some amazing diving catches and played some vital innings, the highlight being holding the lower order together against Souths in the third round to ensure we had enough runs to defend. Shaun’s continued hard work and his performances throughout the season saw him rewarded with his A grade debut.

Scott Schultz: Scott started the season in B grade, however he quickly proved he was not just worthy of a spot in Reserve grade, he became a vital member of the team and with Jake he was leading our bowling attack by the mid-way point of the season. Scott’s ability to move the ball a long way and maintain great control and good pace for a prolonged spell makes it difficult for opposition batsmen. His junior nickname of “buckets” may stick as he took some amazing catches throughout the season also including one in the grand final.

Jake Gill: Jake’s first full season in Reserve grade and he has led the bowling attack from game one with 3/7 off 4 overs in our first game and finished the season with the deserved award of player of the final. Jake’s ability to bowl long spells and fill any role asked of him with the ball have been a huge asset to the team.

Mark Twyford: An important member of the team and club, extremely unlucky to miss out on a spot in the grand final but as

Mark always does, he was able to find a way to lift the team, whether that was through saving runs in the field or cheering his teammates on and offering advice.

Dan Gabbett, Jeff Neale & Len Van Der Linden: Dan, Jeff and Len played a huge part of the success of the team this season, Dan and Jeff providing vital run's when needed, unfortunately Len will have to wait one more season to add to his impressive Reserve grade run tally.
